What do we do?

RSPCA Cornwall Branch is a **self-funded** charity, rehoming hundreds of animals each year, regardless of age, health or background.

Opened in 1996 by William and Patricia Venton, we rely entirely on local support to fund our **£950,000** annual running costs.

Fundraising Ideas



Go it alone - GO BIG

- **Charity skydive** – a big thrill for a big cause!
- **Challenge trek** – join one of our organised walks, like the Jurassic Coast trek or Great Wall of China
- **Sponsored walk, run or cycle** – set a personal distance or goal
- **Car Boot sale** - sell your pre-loved items
- **Host a pamper night** - Invite your friends over for a pamper then just ask for a donation to help save animals.



Sky High Support

Sarah took fundraising to new heights by bravely completing a skydive to support RSPCA Cornwall Branch.

Her incredible courage raised a whopping £917 to help animals in need.



Team up at work

- **Hold a bake sale** - Who doesn't love cake!
- **Dress down Friday**- Charge a pound or two for the privilege.
- **Raffle**- Everyone loves a raffle any time of year.
- **Matched giving**- Find out if your employer offers matched giving – many companies will match what you raise, doubling your total!




Other fun ideas

- **Sponsored Silence** - Ask for a donation to stay quiet for a specific amount of time
- **Bingo night** – Raise money through admissions, selling recyclable bingo sheets and refreshments
- **Guess the number of sweets in the jar** - £1 a guess

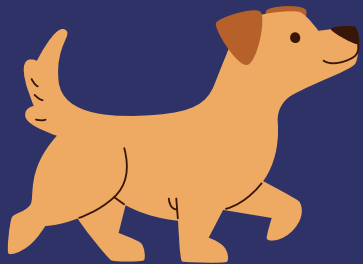

HOW YOUR MONEY WILL MAKE A DIFFERENCE

As a self-funded branch, we depend on amazing supporters like you to keep helping animals in need – we truly couldn't do it without you.

SPONSORED SILENCE



£50 provides a cosy bed, flea and worm treatment, and comforting toys and treats to help a frightened animal feel safe, healthy and loved.

CAKE SALE



£100 covers vaccinations, microchipping, a vet check and basic care for a newly rescued animal, while also helping to provide behavioural support for pets who are nervous or traumatised.

CAR BOOT SALE



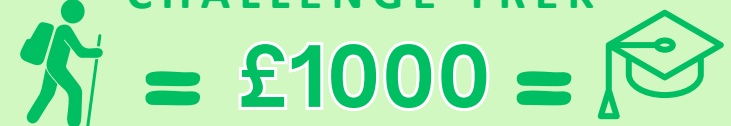
£300 feeds all our animals for a week, funds vet care for several, and provides essential enrichment.

SKYDIVE



£600 provides months of care, emergency treatment, and helps keep kennels and catteries warm, clean and safe.

CHALLENGE TREK



£1000 helps rehabilitate severely neglected animals, funds urgent medical care, and supports education to prevent cruelty.

Fundraising Boosters

- Ask for donations instead of birthday or Christmas gifts.
- Ask your employer if they offer matched giving; this is a great way to double up your efforts.
- It is all about good timing – ask for sponsorship on pay day.

Raising Money Online

- Set up your fundraising page, the earlier the better, by visiting: [justgiving.com](https://www.justgiving.com)
- Setting a target can help raise up to 46 percent more! If you hit your target push it up again.
- Tell your story with words and pictures – giving the reason behind your fundraising can help raise more

In The Press

Tell the press, including your local newspaper, radio and TV, about your amazing plans as they love to hear about what is going on in the community. Remember to include a quote, how people can support you, and the reason for your fundraising. Do not forget to mention that the **RSPCA Cornwall Branch is a self-funded charity**, relying entirely on local support to care for animals in need.

The Legal Bit

Before you start fundraising, check the rules to keep things safe and legal, especially if you are offering food or alcohol, running a raffle, or collecting money in public. Visit <https://www.rspcacornwall.org.uk/fundraise/> and read our fundraising terms and conditions to learn more.

WAYS TO MAKE YOUR FUNDRAISING KINDER TO ANIMALS

- **Skip paper invites** – Use email, social media or text instead. It is better for the planet.
- **Give travel info** – Let guests know how to get to your event. Share public transport options and encourage walking, cycling or car sharing.
- **Use real mugs** – Hosting a coffee morning? Use mugs or tea cups instead of single-use cups. Check your local RSPCA charity shop for second-hand crockery.
- **DIY decorations** – Make pom poms from tissue paper or paper chains from old newspapers or cards.
- **Make your own bunting** – Use fabric from old clothes or download our paper bunting at rspca.org.uk/fundraisingresources
- **Choose bubbles over balloons** – Balloons can harm animals. Bubbles are safer and just as fun
- **Tidy up** – Do not forget to collect all rubbish at the end of your event.

JUST A FEW SIMPLE CHANGES CAN MAKE A HUGE DIFFERENCE TO OUR ENVIRONMENT AND THE ANIMALS WE SHARE THE PLANET WITH.

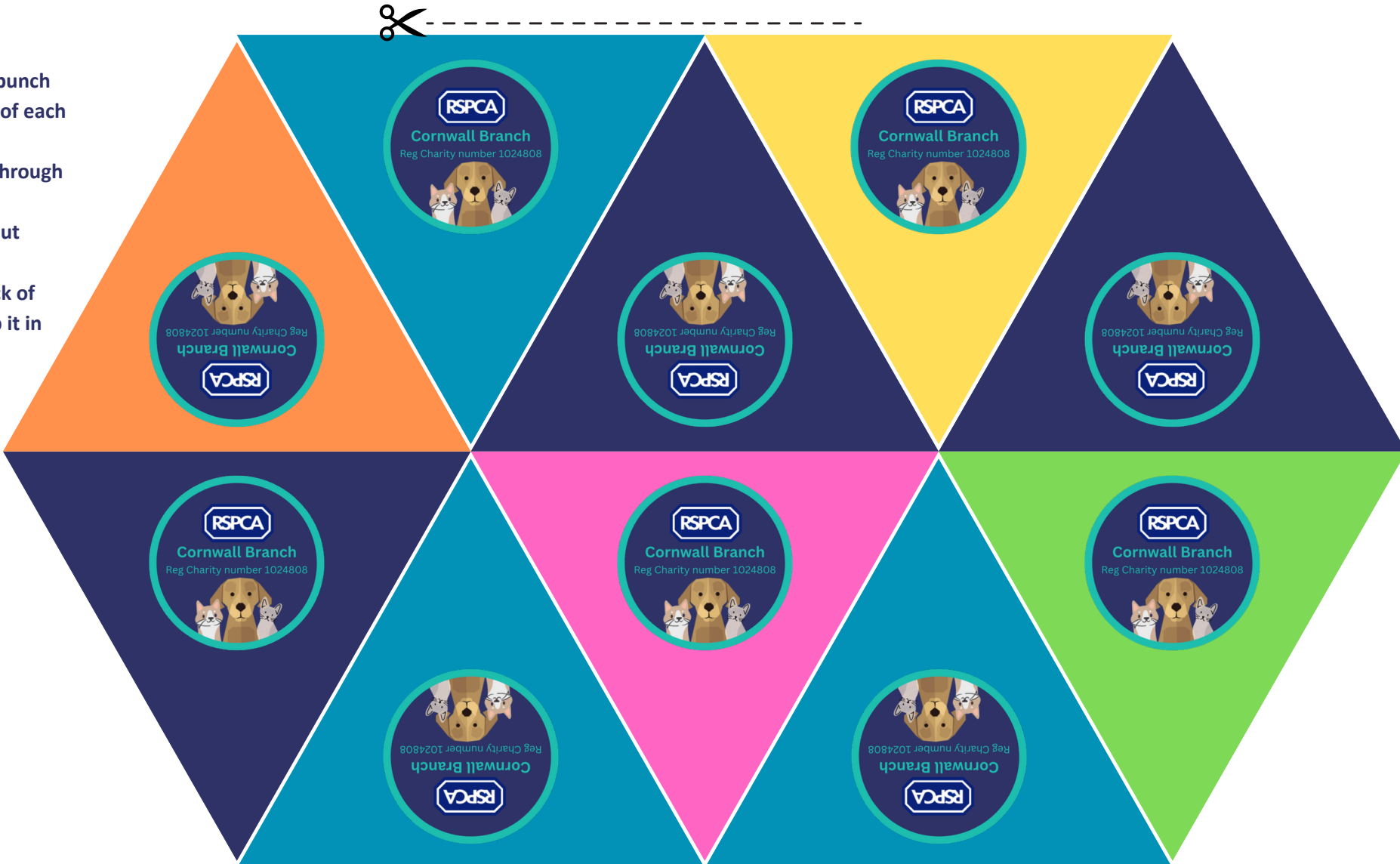
A BIG Thank You!

How To Make Your Bunting

- 1. Cut out the flags.
- 2. Using a hole punch, punch two holes at the top of each triangle.
- 3. Thread some string through the holes.
- 4. Space the triangles out evenly.
- 5. Stick tape on the back of each triangle to keep it in place.

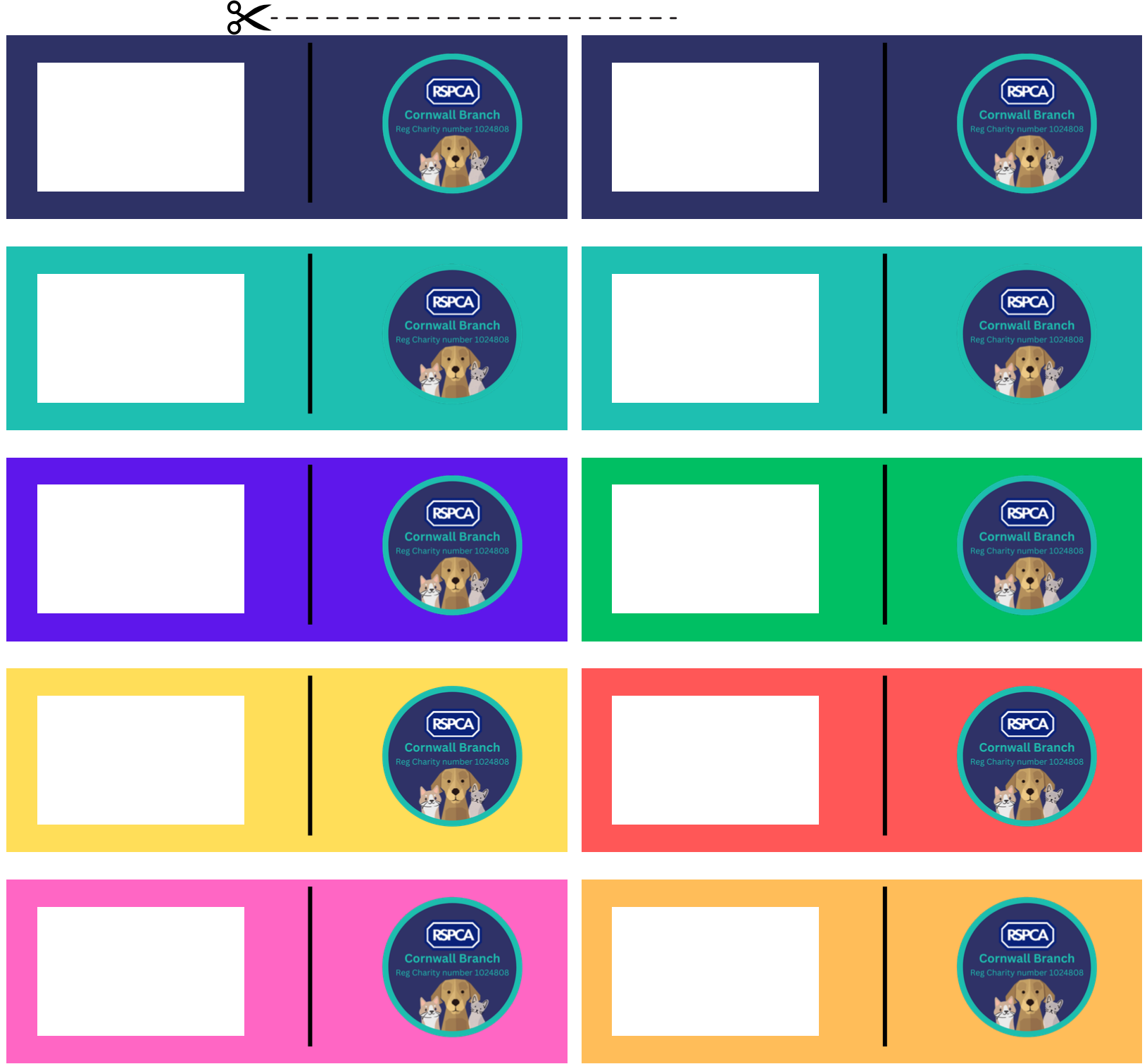

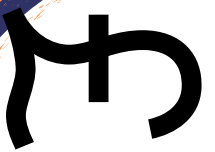
